Message by Parish Priest

EVANGELII GAUDIUM

will restore the joy of faith to their hearts and inspire a commitment to the Gospel. Lastly, we cannot forget that evangelization is first and foremost about preaching the Gospel to those who do not know Jesus Christ or who have always rejected him. Many of them are quietly seeking God, led by a yearning to see his face, even in countries of ancient Christian tradition. All of them have a right to receive the Gospel. Christians have the duty to proclaim the Gospel without excluding anyone. Instead of seeming to impose new obligations, they should appear as people who wish to share their joy, who point to a horizon of beauty and who invite others to a delicious banquet. It is not by proselytizing that the Church grows, but "by attraction". John Paul II asked us to recognize that "there must be no lessening of the impetus to preach the Gospel" to those who are far from Christ, "because this is the first task of the Church". Indeed, "today missionary activity still represents the greatest challenge for the Church" and "the missionary task must remain foremost". What would happen if we were to take these words seriously? We would realize that missionary outreach is *paradigmatic for all the Church's activity*. Along these lines the Latin American bishops stated that we "cannot passively and calmly wait in our church buildings"; we need to move "from a pastoral ministry of mere conservation to a decidedly missionary pastoral ministry". This task continues to be a source of immense joy for the Church: "Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance" (Lk 15:7). *The scope and limits of this Exhortation: 16* I was happy to take up the request of the Fathers of the Synod to write this Exhortation. In so doing, I am reaping the rich fruits of the Synod's labours. In addition, I have sought advice from a number of people and I intend to express my own concerns about this particular chapter of the Church's work of evangelization. Countless issues involving evangelization today might be discussed here, but I have chosen not to explore these many questions which call for further reflection and study. Nor do I believe that the papal magisterium should be expected to offer a definitive or complete word on every question which affects the Church and the world. It is not advisable for the Pope to take the place of local Bishops in the discernment of every issue which arises in their territory. In this sense, I am conscious of the need to promote a sound "decentralization". *17* Here I have chosen to present some guidelines which can encourage and guide the whole Church in a new phase of evangelization, one marked by enthusiasm and vitality. In this context, and on the basis of the teaching of the Dogmatic Constitution Lumen Gentium, I have decided, among other themes, to discuss at length the following questions: a) the reform of the Church in her missionary outreach; b) the temptations faced by pastoral workers; c) the Church, understood as the entire People of God which evangelizes; d) the homily and its preparation; e) the inclusion of the poor in society; f) peace and dialogue within society; g) the spiritual motivations for mission.

1st Reading: Joshua 5:9-12

The long wait of the people to occupy the promised Land is over. After having occupied the land they celebrate the Passover and enjoy the produce of the land, and the manna ceases.

Response Ps: 34

Taste and see that the Lord is good.

2nd Reading: Corinthians 5:17-21

Paul informs the Corinthians that after having attained a new identity in Christ on account of their faith in him, they are eligible to become ambassadors of Christ.

Gospel: Lk 15:1-3, 11-32

The parable of the lost and found are told by Jesus in response to the murmur of the Pharisees and the Scribes at Jesus's association with the underprivileged.

prayer of the faithful

REFLECTION

Today is referred to as 'Laetare Sunday' which is a call to be joyful. It is a reminder during this season of repentance that there is much to be joyful for. That is brought out in the readings for today where we are told that God is merciful, that he forgives our sins and that he will welcome us back with open arms. In our first reading we see that the Israelites have arrived in the Promised Land which they entered with Joshua at their head, following the death of Moses. In the second reading St Paul writes to the people of Corinth about the reconciliation which has been won by Jesus Christ. Not alone have they been reconciled with God through Jesus Christ through the forgiveness of sins but they are now ambassadors of that reconciliation – they have a duty and responsibility as baptized Christians to bring that reconciliation to those whom they meet, beginning at home and then going out into the workplace. As ambassadors they don't simply represent Jesus Christ but they prolong his visible presence in the world. In our gospel for today we have the story of the Prodigal Son, a story which reminds us of the great love of the Father for his people even when they stray from his love. The younger son had essentially insulted his father by asking for his inheritance before the father died. The story is a powerful reminder that the Lord is always waiting for us to return and is happy to welcome us back. Yet at the same time we can continue to place ourselves outside of the banquet hall by continuing in our judgmental and selfish ways because God will not force his love on any of us – we must choose it for ourselves.

आज के दिन को आनन्द के रविवार' के रूप में जाना जाता है, जो हर्षित होने का आह्वान है। यह पश्चाताप के इस मौसम के दौरान एक अनुस्मारक है कि वहाँ बहुत खुशी के लिए होना है। यह आज के पाठों में सामने लाया गया है जहाँ हमें बताया गया है कि ईश्वर दयालु है, कि वह हमारे पापों को क्षमा कर देता है और वह खुले हाथों से हमारा स्वागत करेगा। पहले पढ़ने में हम देखते हैं कि इस्राएलियों ने वादा किए हुए देश में आगमन किया है जो उन्होंने मूसा की मृत्यु के बाद जोशुआ के साथ प्रवेश किया था। दूसरे पाठ में संत पौलुस ने कुरिन्थ के लोगों से मेल मिलाप के बारे में लिखा है जो यीशु मसीह द्वारा जीता गया है। न केवल वे पापों की क्षमा के माध्यम से यीशु मसीह के माध्यम से भगवान के साथ सामंजस्य स्थापित किया गया है, लेकिन वे अब उस मेल-मिलाप के राजदूत हैं - उनके पास एक कर्तव्य और जिम्मेदारी है बपतिस्मा प्राप्त ईसाई के रूप में जो लोग मिलते हैं, घर पर शुरुआत करते हैं और फिर जा रहे हैं कार्यस्थल में बाहर। राजदूत के रूप में वे केवल यीशु मसीह का प्रतिनिधित्व नहीं करते हैं, लेकिन वे दुनिया में अपनी दृश्य उपस्थिति को लम्बा खींचते हैं। आज के हमारे सुसमाचार में हमारे पास प्रोडिगल सन की कहानी है, जो एक ऐसी कहानी है जो हमें अपने लोगों के लिए पिता के महान प्रेम की याद दिलाती है जब वे उनके प्यार से भटक जाते हैं। छोटे बेटे ने पिता के मरने से पहले अपनी विरासत के लिए अपने पिता का अनिवार्य रूप से अपमान किया था। कहानी एक शक्तिशाली याद दिलाती है कि प्रभु हमेशा हमारे लौटने की प्रतीक्षा कर रहे हैं और हमारे वापस लौटने पर खुश हैं। फिर भी हम अपने निर्णय और स्वार्थी तरीकों से जारी रखकर खुद को बैंकेट हॉल के बाहर रख सकते हैं क्योंकि भगवान हममें से किसी पर भी अपने प्यार को नहीं छोड़ेंगे - हमें इसे अपने लिए चुनना चाहिए।
