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**Message by Parish Priest**

My dear brothers and sisters! Today is a joyful day for all of us as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and our parish feast. The Sacred Heart stands as a powerful symbol of the whole human body of Jesus Christ. The heart is at its core, representing the very Divine and Human Life of Jesus, our Saviour; a Heart which beat as he preached the Good News and healed the sick; a Heart that stopped on the cross and was then pierced by the soldier's lance. It is also the Heart that beat once more at the Resurrection and continues to do so for us today. The Sacred Heart of Jesus is therefore a powerful reminder of the love of Christ poured out for us all.

Today the Mother Church also commemorates the 'World Day of Migrants and Refugees'. The Message of Holy Father Pope Francis on this occasion is titled as, "Like Jesus Christ, forced to flee". COVID -19 and the lockdown related to it has created havoc in many parts of the world. I have had the privilege of being part of the relief work for the migrants who were fleeing the Capital city due to hunger and lack of employment. It was heart-rending to see the way families were fleeing the city with whatever they could carry. We can imagine the plight of Joseph, Mary and Jesus who were forced to flee to Egypt.

We have witnessed migrants fleeing from the cities towards their homeland, without food and medication. Our Archdiocese has been reaching out to them through the instrumentality of Commission for Migrants, Chetanalya and CRI in distributing food and meeting their immediate need for survival. The World Day of Migrants and Refugees is always an occasion to express concern for many different vulnerable people on the move; to pray for the challenges and increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers.

Pope Francis, in one of his homilies during the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus said, "It is more difficult to let God love us than to love Him! The best way to love Him in return is to open our hearts and let Him love us." May the celebration of the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus help us to allow God to love us and by experiencing the love of God may we be able to cultivate a loving and tender heart to the migrants and refugees.

Happy Feast. May the Sacred Heart of Jesus Bless us all!

It is also the Heart that beat once more at the Resurrection and continues to do so for us today. The Sacred Heart of Jesus is therefore a powerful reminder of the love of Christ poured out for us all.

The heart is the center of a person, the place from which s/he makes the choices which will affect the world within them and around them. Devotion to the Heart of Jesus reminds us that it is in His Sacred Humanity that we find the pattern for becoming fully human ourselves. In His Incarnation, saving life, death and Resurrection, we receive both the pattern and the means to become more like Him.

Today the Mother Church also commemorates the 'World Day of Migrants and Refugees'. The Message of Holy Father Pope Francis on this occasion is titled as, "Like Jesus Christ, forced to flee". COVID -19 and the lockdown related to it has created havoc in many parts of the world. According the UN report, India is a home of 2, 10,201 (2 lakhs ten thousand and two hundred and one) registered refugees and 140 million migrants out of which Delhi accommodates 40,854 (forty thousand and eight hundred and fifty four) refugees. We have witnessed migrants fleeing from the cities towards their homeland, without food and medication. The World Day of Migrants and Refugees is always an occasion to express concern for many different vulnerable people on the move; to pray for the challenges and increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers.

Pope Francis, in one of his homilies during the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus said, "It is more difficult to let God love us than to love Him! The best way to love Him in return is to open our hearts and let Him love us." Let us pray to Jesus that we may have a heart that allows the Sacred Heart to love us and protect us.

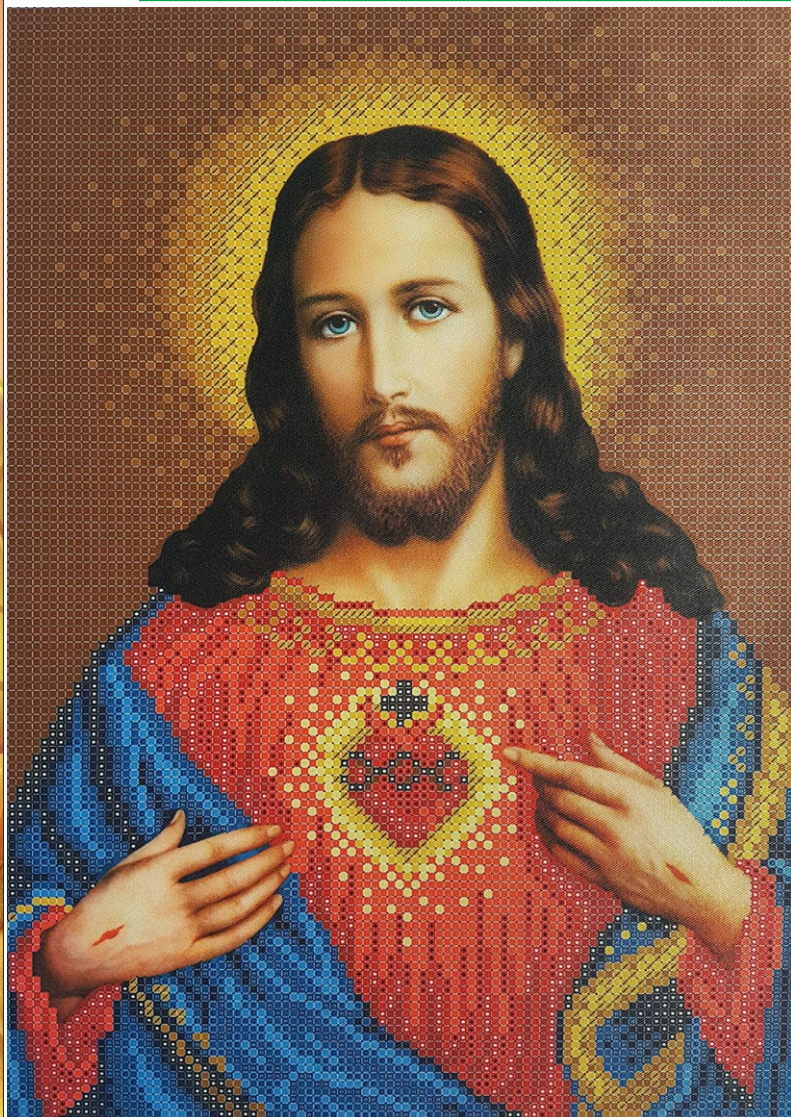
