PARISH PRIEST'S CORNER

Dear Friends.

Today's Gospel passage has taken us once again into the famous parable of the Talents. A man, going on a journey, summoned his slaves and entrusted his property to them; to one he gave five talents, to another two talents, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away.

Talent was not a coin, it was a weight; and therefore, its value obviously depended on whether the coinage involved was copper, gold or silver. The commonest metal at the Time of Jesus was silver. Jesus' listeners were well aware of the amount of wealth entrusted to each servant.

This parable has a number of messages for us. First of all it tells us that God gives man differing gifts. One man received five talents, another two, and another one. It is not a man's talent which matters; what matters is how he uses it. God never demands from a man ability which he has not got. The parable express that men are not equal in talent; but men can be equal in effort. It is quite remarkable that the man simply entrusted the talents to the servants. He did not tell them what to do with them. Neither did he tell them that he would demand them back on his return. The servants drew conclusions for themselves. Two of them decided to take risk and put them to use. While the third decided to play safe, burying it.

As the man expected his servants to be fruitful we are also expected to be fruitful. We are also expected to appreciate all of the gifts that we have received, not only appreciate them but also use them to their greatest potential. Millions of people passed through this earth. All of them had their own special talents; but only a handful of them dared to try out them. All of them had dreams; but only a score of them looked for their fulfilment. All of them had their own ideas; but only a few of them decided to try them out.

We are all gifted with some strength. The small size of the humming bird, weighing only a tenth of an ounce, gives it the flexibility to perform complicated maneuvers, such as beating its wings 75 times a second. This enables the humming bird to drink nectar from flowers while hovering, but it cannot soar, glide or hop. The Ostrich, at 300 pounds, is the largest bird, but it can't fly. However, its legs are so strong that it can run at up to 50 miles per hour, taking strides of 12-15 feet.

The second message of the parable is that it tells us that the reward of work well done is still more work to do. The two servants who had done well are not told to sit back and rest. But, they are given greater tasks. One talent was taken away from the man who hid it, and was given to the one who had received five talents. At our work place, at home or at the parish, when we do something good, we are given more responsibilities, instead of being grateful we grumble and complain. Thirdly, the parable tells us that the man who is punished is the man who would not try. The man with one talent did not lose it; but he simply did nothing with it.

Dear friends, the only way to keep a gift is to use it in the service of God and in the service of our fellow men. Let us made an earnest effort in discovering God given talents and making use of it in the service of God and service of fellow peoples.

REFLECTION

The readings of this Sunday teaches us to become aware of God-given talents, abilities and skills and use them fruitfully for the glory of God and for the service of the Kingdom of God.

The first reading suggests that we should be diligent and industrious as a loyal and faithful wife, in the use of our God-given gifts and talents with "the fear of the Lord." Unlike the one-talent man, she takes her gifts and "brings forth good, not evil"; she "reaches her hands to the poor and extends her arms to the needy," and she is a portrait of responsible readiness. The parable of the talents challenges us to do something positive, constructive and life-affirming with our talents here and now. We are invited by the Lord to use our talents not just for ourselves but primarily to give glory to God and use all our talents fruitfully for the service of the Kingdom of God and for others. Today's Gospel challenges us to ask these questions: Am I ready to change? Am I using my talents and gifts primarily to glory to God? Am I using my talents to serve my brothers and sisters? We need to do three things if we want to become God's faithful servants: Being ready to change and grow, make use of God-given talents and use them for the service of others and give glory to God.

Let us then make the best use of the talents God has given to us, we will be able to hear Lord saying: "Well done, my good and faithful servant! Come and share the joy of your master".


