

SACRED HEART CATHEDRAL

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Message by Parish Priest



Dear Friends in Christ!

At first sight, today's gospel seems to contain nothing new or startling that was not already known by the Jews of the Old Testament. Indeed the words, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength and with all your mind," were words written

on the heart of every Jew, and to this day they form part of the daily prayer a devout Jew is required to say. This prayer is referred to as the Shema, because it begins with the Hebrew words, "Shema Yisrael," meaning "Listen Israel." "Listen Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord," and it continues with the words just quoted. And yet, there is a certain paradox about today's gospel reading, in that it tells us that love of God is realised by our love for each other.

In other words, our love of God is illusory if it stops short with God, if it does not result in our loving each other, reaching out to everyone without exception, even our enemies. But then, a word of caution, love of neighbour, if it is divorced from love of God, can well become refined self-love. For one can easily end up loving others purely for the response one gets from those loved, for the feeling of satisfaction and self-gratification one derives from being generous and kind to them. A Jewish Rabbi, named Hillel, a renowned scholar, a spiritual and ethical leader of his generation, who had a great following just before the birth of Christ, when asked, "Which is the greatest commandment?," gave the famous reply, "What you hate for yourself, do not do to your neighbour. This is the whole law; the rest is commentary."

Jesus, however, stated that love of God linked with love of neighbour jointly form the greatest commandment. Commenting on that, the advice of St Augustine was, "Love God first, and then do what you will," meaning that if we love God with all our heart, soul, strength and mind, then we cannot but be obedient to his will, which wants others to share in that love. St John, the evangelist, who saw all the events of Christ's life on earth in terms of love, and kept preaching about this virtue to the early Christians, to the extent that they became wearied of it, and asked him to talk about something else, St John in his first letter puts it forcibly like this, "Anyone who says, "I love God," and hates his brother, is a liar, for how can a man who does not love the brother that he can see, love God whom he has never seen. So this is the commandment that he has given us, that anyone who loves God must also love his brother" (1 Jn 4:20f).

The Synodal process we have begun in the Church all over the world, is in fact an invitation to follow this command of loving God and loving our neighbor. The following of this commandment will help us to walk together with every member of the Church towards the fulfillment of the Mission entrusted to each one of us. Its only when we are able to love God and our neighbor we will be able to work towards the Participation, Communion and Mission envisioned by Pope Francis.

SUNDAY READINGS & REFLECTION

1st Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6

This passage contains the prayer of the Jews popularly known as the “Shema” which means “hear”.

Response Ps 18

I love you, Lord, my strength

2nd Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28

Compared to Jesus who is the Eternal Priest, the priesthood of Jewish priests end when they die.

Gospel: Mark 12:28-34

This passage can be called the “Shema” of the Christians for Jesus gives the love for God and neighbour as the summit of the New Law.

REFLECTION

Since Jesus and his disciples arrived in Jerusalem, Jesus has met with opposition from a number of different groups. The temple authorities were not happy about his cleansing the temple, turning over the tables of the moneychangers. Nor were they happy about his popularity with the crowds, who were spellbound by his teaching. So, the chief priests, scribes, and elders of the temple confronted Jesus, questioning his authority. Then they sent some Pharisees and Herodians to try and trap him with a trick question. And then the Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, also came to argue with him. A scribe, who overheard the debate between Jesus and the Sadducees, was impressed with what Jesus had to say. He wanted to hear more from him. So he asks Jesus his own question, not to trick him or entrap him, but to learn from him.

He asks Jesus: What is the first of all the commandments? He replied: “There is only one Lord and God.” And you are “to love the Lord your God with your whole heart, soul and mind and you shall love your neighbour as yourself.”

Jesus places love of God as the heart of the law; love of neighbour should and will spring naturally from this as a consequence. Our relationship with God has a huge impact on our relationship with our neighbour. It is impossible to say with a pure conscience that we love God and hate our neighbour. The time we spend with God each day makes us more aware of the people we encounter every day. Spiritual writers remind us that Jesus command to love our neighbour is also closely linked to this command to love God that we ignore our brother we will soon ignore God also.

Love in the biblical sense is concrete, active, and embodied. Anyone can love in theory, or in general. But loving the person, the flesh-and-blood person in front of us—loving in the messiness and ambiguities of our close relationships, our communities, and our public life—now that is a different story! It is hard, humbling work.

If we try to love God alone, we may be tempted into self-absorbed piety or self-absorbed activism, running roughshod over people and sacrificing everything and everyone else to our own salvation. And if we try to love neighbour alone, we may lose your centre, trying to be all things to all people, and forgetting that God is God, and we are not. In both cases, the temptation is to twist religion to feed our own ego or to suit our own agenda. Loving God wholeheartedly and loving neighbour as oneself involve a lot of effort and sacrifice. Yet, it is the only way to live an authentic Christian life.


