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
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Message by Parish Priest



My dear Friends,

This week we reflect on the missionary dynamism and attraction of the early Church in Jerusalem. It all depended on the fearless proclamation of the apostles, the heroic courage of the martyrs, intense life

of prayer and solidarity among the early Christians. (Cf 2/4-7)

In the history of the Christian mission, it was the testimony of the life of the individual Christians and the community of believers whose lives drew people to Jesus and his message. It was especially the willingness of martyrs to suffer and die for their faith that convinced the people of the power and truth of the message of Jesus Christ. Today, more than ever, there is a need to make the message of Jesus credible again. Only an authentic witness of radically living the message of the Gospel in our personal lives and in our Christian communities will make this happen. As we are in the Extraordinary month of the Missions, we are called upon to look back into our lives to see if we are like the early Christians. And to introspect and see how we can truly be effective and credible witnesses of Jesus Christ.

We don't have to travel long distances to find people who have lived credible lives as witnesses of Jesus. Our own country has many such witnesses, some very well celebrated, some very obscure. We are very much familiar with St. Alphonse, St. Theresa of Calcutta, St. John the Britto, St. Gonsalo Garcia, St. Kuriakose Chavara, St. Euphrasia, St. Joseph Vaz, Bl. Mariam Theresia, Bl. Devasahayam Pillai, Bl. Augustine Thevarapampil and Bl. Rani Maria. As the Vatican document states, **"Holiness is the most attractive face of the Church"** May the above mentioned holy people inspire and attract more and more people to Jesus Christ.

REFLECTION

In today's Gospel, (St. Luke 17:11-19) we see the incident of the ten lepers as our Lord was on His way to Jerusalem, where He was to die on the cross so that we could live eternally. The Church brings it before our minds today, not so much to remind us of the mercy and kindness of Jesus to all classes, even the outcasts, as lepers were, as to make us see and be amazed at the depths of ingratitude to which men can sink. This is but one of many such examples of ingratitude that occurred during Christ's public ministry, most of those He miraculously cured forget to thank Him. In today's incident there was one, and he was the one least expected to do so, who had the decency to return and thank his benefactor. This pleased our Lord and led Him to remark on the ingratitude of the others. "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" He was surprised and also sad for their sakes, not for his own. They missed greater graces through this lack of appreciation and gratitude. In all of this it was their own self-interest which came first in the minds of the nine Jews. Once they found their leprosy gone all they thought of was their own good fortune. Their Benefactor was quickly forgotten. The Samaritan's first thought, on the other hand, was of the one who had healed him. He was as delighted as the others with his cure but being generous and thoughtful for others, he felt it his bounden duty to return and thank the man who had done him this miraculous good turn.

How many of us are numbered amongst these ungrateful ones? Many of us think of God only when we are in difficulties. While things are going well, when there is no sickness in the home, when our business is prospering, when there is peace all around us, how many times in the week do we say, "thank you, God, you are very good to me." When trouble strikes we rush to church, we implore God to have pity on us, we make novenas to our special saints. This is not wrong. What is wrong, however, is that we forgot to thank God all the time that He was giving us spiritual and temporal favours.

We all need to be more grateful to God every day of our lives—more grateful than we have been. He has not only given us life on this earth with its joys and its sorrows, but He has prepared for us a future life where there will be no admixture of sorrows. It is for that life that we are working. It is because there is a heaven after death that we are Christians. God has already done His part in preparing this heaven for us. He is assisting us daily to get there. We need a lot of that assistance and one of the surest ways of getting further benefits from God (as well as from men) is to show true gratitude for the benefits already received.
