



Message by Parish Priest



Dear Friends,

Today we reflect on the second beatitude with Pope Francis. 'Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.' In the Greek; language, in which the Gospel is written, this Beatitude is expressed with a verb that isn't passive- in fact, the blessed don't suffer this mourning- but in the active they are afflicted." They mourn but from within. It's an attitude that became central in Christian spirituality and that the Desert fathers, the first monks of history, called "penthos" an interior sorrow that opens to a relationship with the Lord and with one's neighbor. In the Scriptures, the mourning can have two aspects: the first is for the death or suffering of someone. The other aspect is the tears for sin- for one's own sin, when the heart bleeds for having offended God and one's neighbor. Hence it's about loving the other in such a way as to bind oneself to him or her to share his pain. There are persons that remain distant, take a step back. Instead, it's important that others break through our hearts.

The second meaning of second beatitude: to weep for sin, it's necessary to make distinction here: there are those who get angry because they were angry, but this is pride. Instead there are those who weep for the harm done, for the good omitted, for the betrayal of the relationship with God. This is the sorrow for not having loved, which flows from having others' life at heart. Here one weeps because one doesn't correspond to the Lord, who loves us so much, and the thought saddens for good not done.

This is the subject of one's errors to be faced- difficult but vital. St. Peter's tears, which led him to a new and much truer love. Peter looked at Jesus and wept and his heart was renewed. As opposed to Judas, who didn't accept his having erred and committed suicide.

May we be able to recognize our failures and be able to weep for our failures that we may be renewed like St. Peter. "Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted."

1st Reading: Leviticus (19:1-2,17-18)

2nd Reading: Corinthians (3:16-23)

Paul realizes that the Corinthians have a confused notion about wisdom. Hence, he invites those who call themselves wise to recognize their ignorance so that they may become wise.

There is a natural desire in us for vengeance but Jesus calls for an unselfish attitude which refuses not only to retaliate but also not to resist the aggressor.

REFLECTION

In today's Gospel Jesus calls us to a higher love. Jesus calls us to forgive and love our enemies! The lesson we have to learn from the passage hardly needs any emphasizing. We must, if we are truly Christian, forgive those who offend or injure us. We must love all men, whether they be friends or enemies. We are commanded to love our neighbours and our enemies; they are generally the same people. But it is my neighbours, those among whom I live and work, who are liable to injure me and thus become my enemies. Charity begins at home, because it is here that it can and should be learned and practiced. It is first and foremost necessary for Christian peace in the home. Husband and wife must learn to understand and tolerate each other's imperfections and faults. If one offends in what the other would regard as something serious, the offended one should not demand an apology but should show forgiveness before the other has humbly to apologize. No two persons in the world, not even identical twins, can agree on all things, so it is vain and unrealistic to expect even one's married partner to agree with one in all points. Christian charity alone can cover the multitude of faults of both partners. If there is peace and harmony between husband and wife, as there will be if both are truly charitable, the children will learn too to be understanding and forgiving. Such a home will be a truly happy home even if it has little of the world's riches.

Our charity must spread from the home to our neighbours—to all those with whom we have contact. It is easy to get on with most people, but in every neighbourhood and in every village or town there will always be those who are difficult. There will be the dishonest, the tale-bearers, the quarrelsome, the critic of everyone and everything. It is when we have dealings with such people that all our Christian charity is necessary. Most likely we will never be able to change their ways of acting, but charity will enable us to tolerate their faults and will move us to pray for their eternal welfare. Life for many, if not for most people, has many dark, gloomy and despairing moments. The man or woman who is moved by true Christian charity can bring a beam of sunshine, a ray of hope, into the lives of these people.


